EWS1 form now available - no external wall remediation required

I am really pleased to be able to confirm that our fire engineer has now issued an EWS1 form (EWS – external wall system) for your building. Following the investigations that took place earlier this year, this certificate confirms that your building has been rated as 'B1 – the fire risk is sufficiently low that no remedial works are required'.

We carried out our own due diligence on the information we have received from the fire engineer and are happy with the rating received and justification given. For those of you who have been looking to sell, remortgage or buy shares in your home, we hope that this will help you to do so. We hope this also provides you with peace of mind that no remedial fire safety work is required to the external wall system.
